



Camp Lutherwood Oregon Board Member Leadership Application Process

Who can serve on the Board of Trustees?

Any member of a Lutheran Church in Oregon, SW Washington and/or N. California who demonstrates a sincere and devoted attitude towards Lutherwood and its ministry is eligible to serve on the board.

What is the time commitment?

All board members are expected to:

- Attend all board meetings – we meet 4-5 times per year, some of which are by teleconference, others face to face.
- Attend any task force/committees as liaison
- Participate in the community of Lutherwood at least once a year
- Fulfill the term of service (1-3 years).

Do I have to serve on a committee/taskforce?

Every board member will serve as a liaison to a committee and/or task force as appropriately assigned. Committed board members are vital to the welfare and future of camp Lutherwood. We are interested in members that are willing to think big, think with vision, and dedicated to continuing the growth and vision of the camp ministries.

What are the Board Responsibilities?

1. You must act with due care in managing the affairs of the corporation
2. Act as a nonprofit corporation
3. Manage camp according to Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation
4. Support Lutherwood prayerfully and financially
5. Formulate and adopt camp policy
6. Oversee financial and legal matters
7. Be a positive voice for Lutherwood in the community
8. Be inquisitive and ask questions, be an active participant
9. Assist in conducting promotional events and activities
10. Secure congregational and individual support
11. Assist and support the Executive Director
